Dear Norma,

I'm pleased to advise you that the U. S. Naval Academy Class of 1960 has established a scholarship in honor of your husband and our classmate, Donnie Lee Darrow, as well as three other members of our class who were killed in action during the Viet Nam war.

The scholarship will be managed by the Athletic and Scholarship Division of the U. S. Naval Academy Foundation, and will be provided to a prospective Midshipman who will benefit from a year of study at a prestigious prep school prior to entrance to the Naval Academy. The selection of the candidate will be made by the Dean of Admissions of the Academy.

The wording of the scholarship is as follows: "The Class of 1960 Memorial Scholarship honors the sacrifice and bravery of our classmates, Donnie Lee Darrow, Alexander McIver Jr., William Marshall Roark, and Martin Nelson Tull, who were killed in action while in the service of our country."

I want you to know that our class holds the memory of your husband in high regard, valued our time together while at the Academy, and feel this endowed scholarship to be a fitting tribute to our friend and shipmate.
